





- ²⁵ But his followers took him by night and lowered him in a basket through an opening in the wall.




Saul Faced Skeptical Astonishment




Saul hated followers of Christ Transformed Enemy – God flipped him


- ¹⁵ But when God, who set me apart from my mother's womb and called me by his grace, was pleased
- ¹⁶ to reveal his Son in me so that I might preach him among the Gentiles, my immediate response was not to consult any human being.
- ¹⁷ I did not go up to Jerusalem to see those who were apostles before I was, but I went into Arabia. Later I returned to Damascus.
- ¹⁸ Then after three years, I went up to Jerusalem to get acquainted with Cephas and stayed with him fifteen days.
- 19 saw none of the other apostles—only James, the Lord's brother.

²³ After many days had gone by, there was a conspiracy among the Jews to kill him,





Verse 24 tells us that Saul was aware of the plot to kill him but that did not stop him






But his **followers** took him by night and lowered him in a basket through an opening in the wall.









"As we live each day, we want to work for Him [Jesus] until He returns, as we know He is coming soon. If He comes today, I am fully prepared, as everybody must give an account."











Despite Wang's old age "he had remained an unrivaled symbol of uncompromising faith until his death".





Imprisoned for 22 years for his faith Chinese policy changed.


But he continued to spread the gospel from his own home. He taped sermons and distributed them. He was still working for Christ in his late eighties.


Saul Faced Rejection





Lesson from Saul


- 1)We can speak up boldly about God and His work in the face of difficult situation:-

Saul's Sacrifices




- Philippians 3:4-7




